Program Description:

In early childhood, patterns of growth, development, and change are widely variable and occur within the context of a child-caregiver relationship. As a result, social-emotional disorders of early childhood present unique treatment challenges, particularly if a caregiver has his/her own history of trauma or social-emotional disturbance. This workshop will pay close attention to development and attachment, as well as traumatic experience, as key factors that influence children's behavioral health outcomes. A range of individual, group, and dyadic (parent/caregiver – child) intervention programs that have proven to be effective for treating young children with social-emotional needs (including disruptive behavior, anxiety disorders, social skills deficits, and early trauma) will be reviewed, identifying goals and key treatment features of each. Components of Motivational Interviewing will also be explored to assist in engaging parents/caregivers who may be hesitant to participate in children's treatment.

Educational Objectives:

At the conclusion of this program participants should be able to:

1. Discuss what is meant by "individual," "group" and "dyadic" interventions for young children.
2. Describe at least 3 important considerations in developing treatment plans for young children.
3. Identify at least 2 dyadic intervention programs that are known to be effective in treating children-in-relationship with their caregivers, addressing a range of behavior disturbance.
4. Examine components/skills associated with Motivational Interviewing.

From Pittsburgh: Follow I-279 North to exit 7C/State Hwy 28 N/Etna/Chestnut St./E Ohio St. Follow PA-28 N to exit 10 for RIDC Dr. Turn right at Beta Dr.

From Downtown Pittsburgh: Take I-279 North approximately 3.5 miles to exit 11/McKnight Road. Take the ramp for McKnight Road. Stay on McKnight Road for about 4.5 miles (passing Northway Mall on your left and proceeding through the traffic light). Merge into the right lane and turn right before the next light onto Babcock Boulevard. Stay to the left and bear left onto Corporate Drive.

From Downtown Pittsburgh: Cross the Fort Duquesne Bridge toward North Side. Follow signs to Route 65 North (Ohio River Boulevard) past the North Side and the West End Bridge. Stay on Rt. 65 North the rest of the way. Pass through Bellevue, Emsworth, Sewickley, Leetsdale and Ambridge. (Note: It is approximately 12 miles from the intersection of Interstate 79 and Route 65 – between Emsworth and Sewickley – to St. Joseph Spirituality Center.) After Ambridge the road becomes a 4-lane open road with a speed limit of 55 mph. Count three (3) traffic lights after this open road. The first traffic light is at the end of the open road with a “Sheetz” gas station on the right. The next light has a Pizza Hut and McDonalds on the right side. After this light, move into the right lane. The third light has a small ice cream store on the right. Shortly after this light (about ten car lengths long), jog to the right onto State Street - a side road that runs parallel to Route 65 - by Anderson’s candy store. St. Joseph Spirituality Center is on the right. The property has three buildings – Mt. Gallitzin Academy, the Convent Building, and Villa St. Joseph. Take the first driveway on the right (marked Sisters of St. Joseph/Mt. Gallitzin Academy) and park in the lot immediately to your right. Walk along the roadway in front of the academy building to the first entrance. If you are lost, call 724-869-2151 for directions.
