WELCOME AND OVERVIEW

The International Conference on Bipolar Disorder has become the most important and well attended meeting focusing on bipolar disorder. Clinicians, researchers, patients, and consumers from around the world will again come together for this three-day conference to share their clinical expertise, research findings, and personal experiences with the goal of improving the quality of life for those living with bipolar disorder. The meeting will take place at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, located in the heart of downtown Pittsburgh, Pa.

The conference will focus on diagnosis of bipolar disorder across the lifespan; advances in neurobiology and genetics; medical prevention and intervention; combined treatment of bipolar disorders; and treatment strategies for comorbid conditions.

Multiple concurrent sessions on diagnostic and treatment issues will take place throughout the meeting. The conference will be held June 25, 26, and 27, 2009. As in the past, poster sessions will be conducted in the evenings, on June 25 and 26. The well-received "Rapid Communications" sessions will be repeated this year.

Presentations during the first two days of the conference will be geared toward academic researchers and research-oriented clinicians. Psychiatrists, psychologists, neuroscientists, and pharmacologists interested in bipolar disorder should find the content of this first phase of the conference useful in their research and clinical practice.

The third day of the conference will include plenary sessions on clinical trials, a diagnosis roundtable, and consumer-focused sessions on cognitive behavioral therapy, family-focused therapy, and interpersonal and social rhythm therapy. These sessions will be appropriate to audiences that include psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, nurses, and other mental health care workers, as well as individuals who have bipolar disorder and their families. Several of the workshops will be focused on issues relevant to advocacy for bipolar disorder.
